

Colvin Run Mill Classes a Success By Joyce Spieler

When Covid-19 disrupted the Northern Virginia Carvers (NVC) ability to meet, our safest place to meet was outside the barn at Colvin Run Mill. As restrictions changed we were able to move inside. Thank goodness for that, especially when the weather turned rainy and cold.

In order to expand our community presence, Fairfax County Parktakes was the answer. Parktakes is Fairfax County Parks



and Recreation offerings of so many activities and classes throughout the county. We developed a three class session for the New Year of 2022. There was an eight student (sixteen years old and older) capacity for the package of classes.

Seven students signed up! Yahoo! With the combined efforts of NVC volunteers (Todd Andre-Colton, Jack Edwards, Michael Wine and Joyce Spieler) we developed the program for the sessions. Since, this was a beginners' class the age old, tried and true carving a ball on a stick provided a fantastic first learning project. I thought of a little twist to this project. We carved a snowman ornament. Three round forms... a great practice in carving in the round.

The otter letter opener was introduced next. The choice of projects included were purposed for a useful end result. The students embraced carving skills with vigor. Of course, carving safety guidelines were shared and followed by all. Carving and Covid inclusive. The second class, the students carved the push/pull oven rack squirrel. This provided more carving skills as to forming curves, concave and convex. The squirrel added the bonus of a kitchen helper in the making.

During our classes the volunteers brought many different carving tools, supplies and carved examples for the students to see, feel and use for more carving exposure.

The sky was the limit. We did have a guest carver come visit. Phuong-Anh Nguyen, a wonderful carver, who produces realistic historical oriental carvings. She recently had a book published of her gorgeous carvings. It was a pleasure to have her as a guest at the Mill.

To round out our session, the last project was a stylized Santa. This project was a challenge because the students started with a rectangular piece of wood and the ability to proportion the final carving to their own vision. Michael Wine headed this project up in the class. He was so enthusiastic, that he also brought and demonstrated making custom eyelet hangers. This went well for the snowman and the Santa carvings. Since the student carvers had so much enjoyment in the carving project, the eyelet making will have to be done another day. Michael, thanks for sharing some of the eyelets for the students.

Everyone felt the program was a success. From the NVC volunteers to all the students. We are in the process of developing more class sessions and open demonstrations to be offered at Colvin Run Mill. Make sure you follow Fairfax County Parktakes and Colvin Run Mill schedules for future carving adventures
